Read Exodus 2:16-22

Did you notice anything new when you read/listened to this story?
What sort of a woman is Zipporah?
Was she a good match for Moses?

CHALLENGE

Which other Bible stories does this one remind you of? When else do a man and a woman meet at a well?

Read Matthew 25:31-46

What surprised you in this story? What might have Jesus original listeners have been surprised by? **CHALLENGE**

Read 1 Samuel 16:1-13 and 1 Samuel 17:1-51

What is the impact of being a shepherd in these two parts of the story?

When else was it important?
